Gallery Review

River Front Gallery Review

The River Front Gallery, located at 132 Lakeville Street (*in Old Town Petaluma*) features a collection of (*mostly*) very modern artworks. One figurative piece, "The Glow From Within," is a huge yellow flower by Lucy Liew. The very largeness of the image gives it a nice op art, surreal look.

One comical sculpture (*of forged metal and salt*) of an enormous squirming octopus is yours for only ten thousand dollars! By Bob Schulte. A cute op-artwork (*a series of four*) by "Lola," is made of a tinted plastic resin, the images rendered in very bright, electric gaudy colors. Lola is a busy artist - one gigantic piece is made of large, bright geometric shapes, covered with a shiny clear resin.

A large stoneware vase "Universe Vase" by Camille Hoffman, displays the artist's emphasis on purply-blue colors. This particular work is a vivid blue, topped with a luscious celadon green rim. Artist Rik Lawrence has constructed a large table (made of bee's wing curly California walnut - a rare wood) supported by a hand forged steel base, all patterned to look like wood. Imposing and elegant.

One eye-catching piece, "Red Jacket" by Stephanie Labaour is made of Navajo Red Clay, hand built and topped with a shiny glazed pattern of leaves and flowers. Rendered in a style reminiscent of Art Deco, this work is smashing. Several nice raku bowls, by Steve Saunders, feature a rich palette of browns, reds, and smoky dark greys.

Lastly, a fine collection of small oil florals by Kathy Bradley, sport a rich palette of pinks and yellows, done in a style reminiscent of early 20th century floral painting. Additionally, there is a large collection of jewelry and small ceramic works in the gift shop area. A fine viewing experience. The gallery is housed in an antique Victorian used brick structure. "American Graffiti" was shot here, remember?

Show is titled "Super 10" and is on til Dec 28.

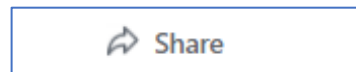
